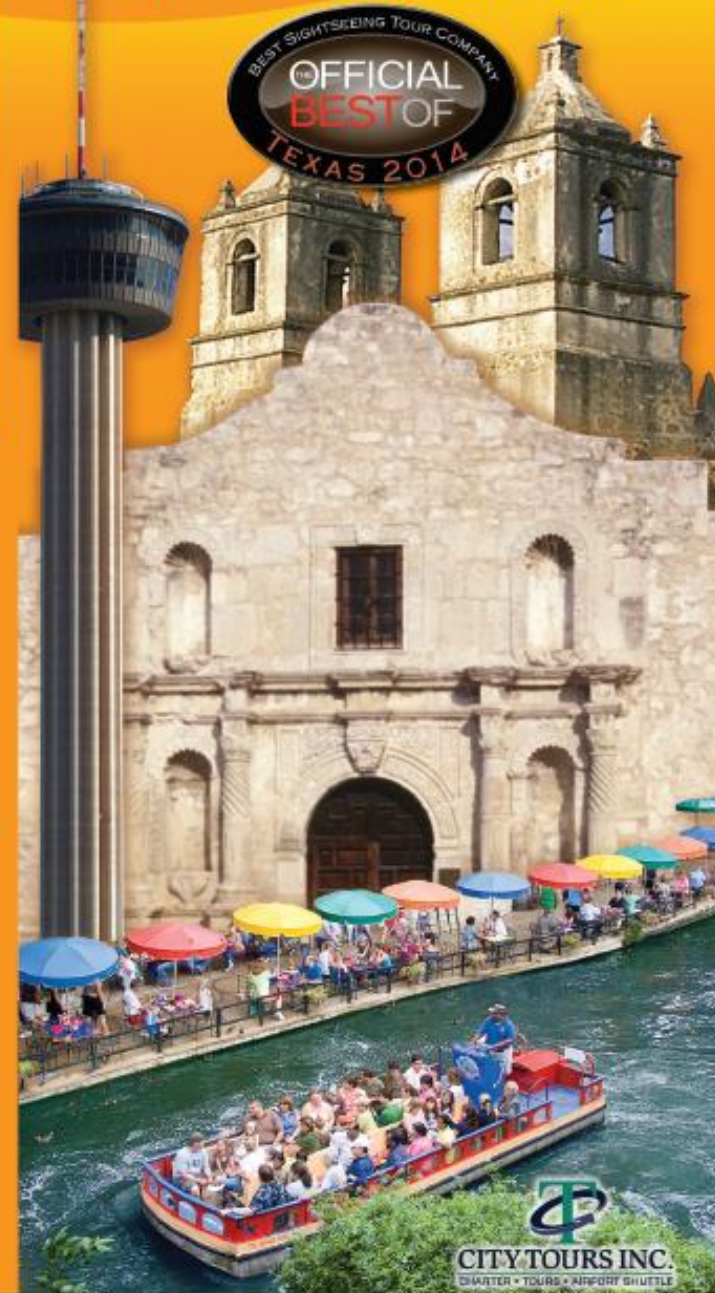

## The Alamo

The Cradle of Texas Liberty, established in 1718 as Mission San Antonio De Valero, the first of five missions built along the San Antonio River, where Davy Crockett, Jim Bowie, Colonel Travis and 186 valiant men sacrificed their lives fighting for Texas Independence. It has become one of the most popular tourist destinations in the United States. Walk through these hallowed grounds and see where these valiant heroes died.

## The Alamo

San Antonio's first Spanish mission founded in 1718 as Mission San Antonio de Valero, famous for the 1836 Battle for Texas Independence.

## Mission San José

Established in 1720, this is the best example of a restored mission in the United States. The famous "Rose Window" and carved stone facade at the entrance are examples of the fine detail and craftsmanship of artisans who built the mission.



## Mission Concepción

Visit Mission Concepción and experience the strength of the Friars who Christianized the Indians. View the original frescos still visible within the rooms of the mission. This is the oldest unrestored stone church in our nation today.

## El Mercado
