• **The Alamo**
 The Cradle of Texas Liberty, established in 1718 as Mission San Antonio De Valero, the first of five missions built along the San Antonio River, where Davy Crockett, Jim Bowie, Colonel Travis and 186 valiant men sacrificed their lives fighting for Texas Independence. It has become one of the most popular tourist destinations in the United States. Walk through these hallowed grounds and see where these valiant heroes died.



• **Riverboat Ride**
 Cruise down the romantic San Antonio River. Discover a world of sidewalk cafes, lush tropical foliage and charming boutiques.

• **Mission Concepción**
 Visit Mission Concepción and experience the strength of the Friars who Christianized the Indians. View the original frescos still visible within the rooms of the mission. This is the oldest unrestored stone church in our nation today.

• **Mission San José**
 The finest example of a completely restored mission in the United States renowned for exquisite stone carvings including the famous Rose Window.



• **Japanese Sunken Gardens**
 The beautiful and architecturally unique old stone quarry, renowned for its beautiful foliage. Drive by the San Antonio Zoo one of the nation's finest zoos, and Brackenridge Park.

• **Buckhorn Saloon and Museum**
 For a taste of the Old West and wildlife exhibits from all over the world, visit San Antonio's classic 1881 saloon and museum. Sip a refreshing drink as you stroll through 33,000 square feet of artifacts from Texas history and world record wildlife exhibits with African, Asian, Alaskan, and North American themes - over 520 different species in all, including fish from the Seven Seas. • **The Alamo**
 San Antonio's first Spanish mission founded in 1718 as Mission San Antonio de Valero, famous for the 1836 Battle for Texas Independence.

• **Mission San José**
 Established in 1720, this is the best example of a restored mission in the United States. The famous "Rose Window" and carved stone facade at the entrance are examples of the fine detail and craftsmanship of artisans who built the mission.



• **Mission Concepción**
 Visit Mission Concepción and experience the strength of the Friars who Christianized the Indians. View the original frescos still visible within the rooms of the mission. This is the oldest unrestored stone church in our nation today.

• **El Mercado**
 Selling colorful Mexican imports from South of the Border. Visit the many Mexican food restaurants and shop for bargains in one of the 35 shops.
