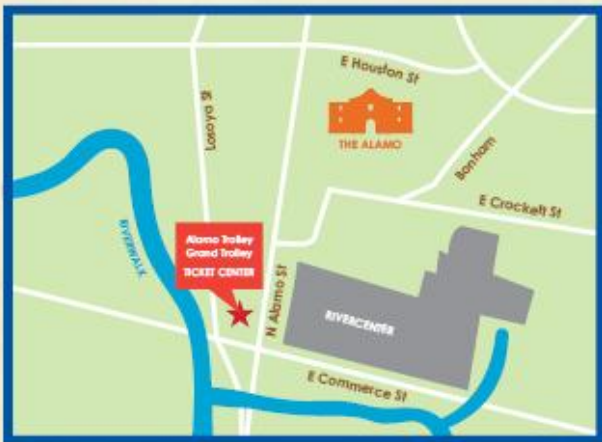

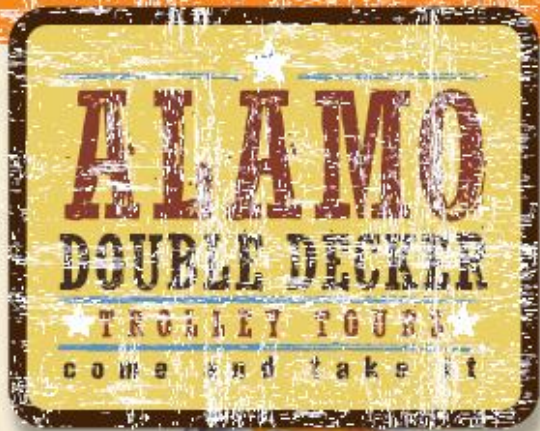

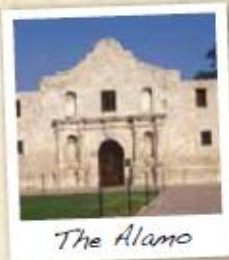

## 1. The Alamo

The cradle of Texas Liberty where Davey Crockett, Jim Bowie, Colonel William Barrett Travis & 186 men sacrificed their lives for Texas independence. Walk through these hallowed grounds and see where these valiant heroes died.

## 2. Rivercenter Mall

A premier shopping, entertainment & dining destination features 100+ retailers including a variety of restaurants and an IMAX Theatre.

## 3. Veterans Memorial Plaza

A memorial to the veterans of all our nation's wars - the plaza's centerpiece is "Hill-881 South" - San Antonio's Vietnam Veterans Memorial.

## 4. El Tropicana Hotel

Built in 1962, the El Trop was the first hotel built on San Antonio's beautiful Riverwalk.

## 5. San Antonio Museum of Art

On gorgeous riverside grounds, the Museum is home to the largest and most comprehensive collection of ancient Egyptian, Greek and Roman, as well as Asian, art in the southern United States.

## 6. The Pearl/Hotel Emma

The Pearl has become a vibrant cultural and culinary neighborhood with unique restaurants, cafes, retailers and public areas. Originally built as Pearl's Brewhouse in 1894, Hotel Emma has an wonderfully rich history and houses its own restaurants and shops.

## 7. The DoSeum

San Antonio's newest interactive museum designed for children 2 through 10 to discover, think, invent, build and more along with their parents (or caregivers). Unlike any other children's museum in the country.

## 8. Fiesta Commission Store

All things Fiesta! Official medals, posters, ornaments, apparel and more.

## 9. Holiday Inn Riverwalk

Located directly on the banks of the Riverwalk.

## 10. Riverwalk/River Boat Ride

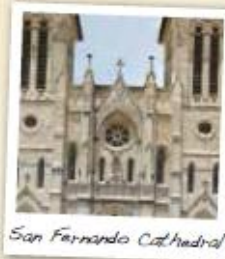
Discover a world of sidewalk cafes, lush tropical foliage and charming boutiques. Take a tour on a River Barge to view the city from a different perspective, or catch a River Taxi to reach a destination.

## 11. San Fernando Cathedral

The oldest cathedral sanctuary in the United States built in 1734 by settlers from the Canary Islands. General Santa Anna raised the flag of "No Quarter" from the tower of the cathedral during the Battle of the Alamo.

## 12. Spanish Governor's Palace

Built in 1749 as the residence and headquarters for the captain of the Spanish Presidio. Called one of the most beautiful buildings in San Antonio by National Geographic, this is a must see. Rooms are furnished with original Spanish period furnishings.

## 13. Market Square

Enjoy El Mercado, filled with shops vending colorful Mexican imports and many Mexican food restaurants. Indulge in tasty pan dulce (Mexican pastries) at Mi Tierra.

## 14. King William Historic District

This 25 block historic district was established in the 1840s by prominent German merchants. Marvel at the beautiful homes nestled along the banks of the San Antonio River. The Steves Homestead and the Carl H. Guenther House are both museums available for touring.

## 15. Southtown

Sneek away to Southtown, a 2 square mile haven just moments away from downtown. A great mix of entertainment, food and shopping.

## 16. Yanaguana Gardens

Fun for everyone awaits! This play environment includes a toddler play area and activities for teens and adults alike.

## 17. La Villita

Site of the city's first neighborhood dating back to the 1750's. Today this area is home to some of the city's most talented artisans and craftsmen.

## 18. HemisFair Park/ Tower of the Americas

Explore over 50,000 sq. ft. of exhibits representing ethnic groups who settled in Texas. Built as the theme structure for HemisFair 1968 The Tower of the Americas offers a spectacular view of the city and features a revolving restaurant, lounge and observation deck.

## 19. Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center

Also built as part of HemisFair '68, the facility now boasts a 1,600,000 sq. ft. footprint. Unveiled in 2016 "Liquid Crystal", a 30' interactive light display, is located near the primary lobby off Market Street.

## 20. San Antonio Fire Museum

A fun experience for kids and adults. Antique fire trucks and artifacts dating back to the mid-1800s, photos and short videos explore the history of Fire Service.

## 21. The Brisco Western Art Museum

A collections-based museum focusing on art and artifacts that tell the stories of the American West. Housed in what was San Antonio's first Public Library, it is adjacent to the McNutt Sculpture Garden.
