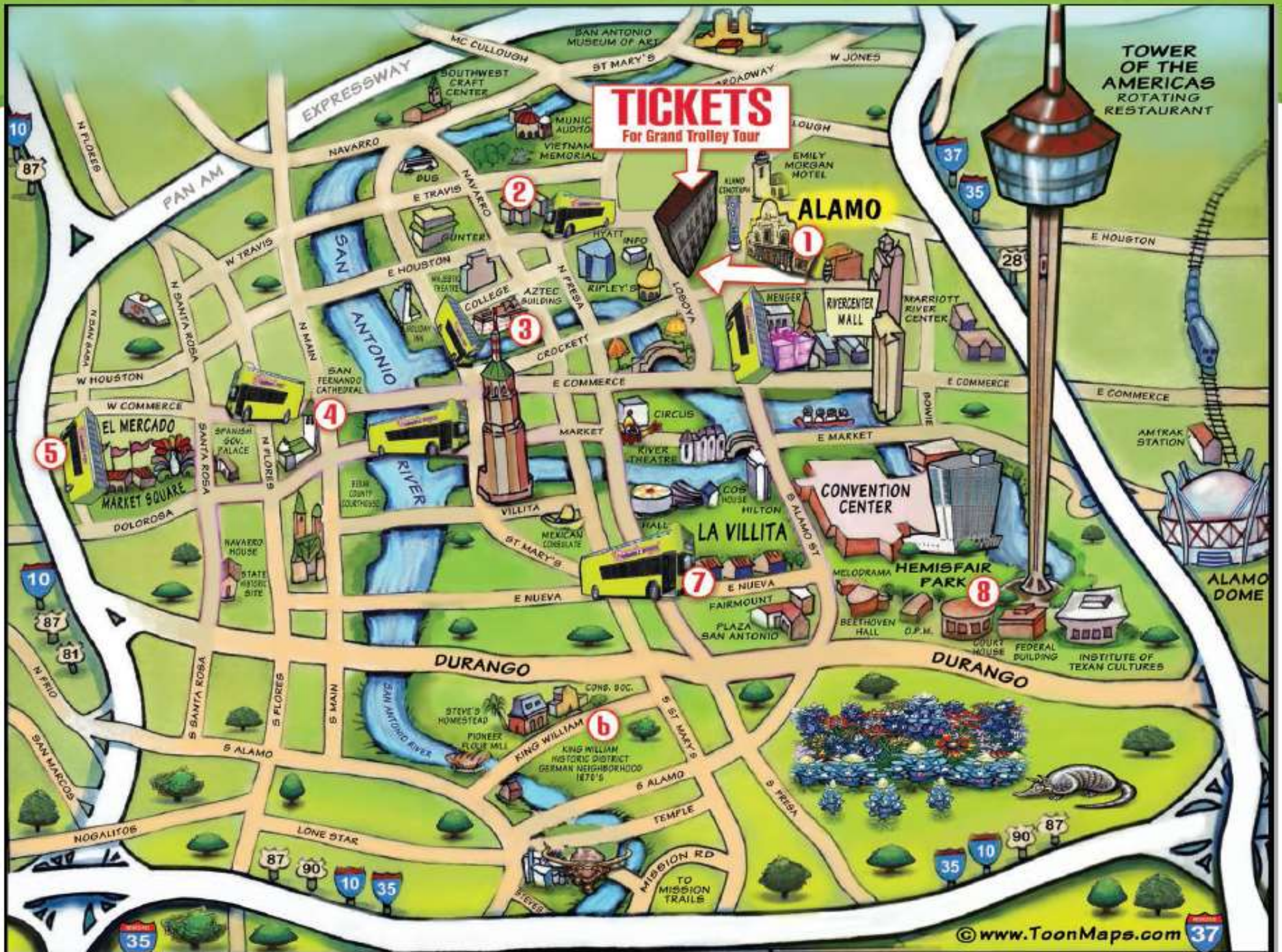

1 THE ALAMO

The cradle of Texas Liberty where Davey Crockett, Jim Bowie, Colonel William Barrett Travis & 186 men sacrificed their lives for Texas independence. Walk through these hallowed grounds and see where these valiant heroes died.



THE RIVERWALK

Discover a world of sidewalk cafes, lush tropical foliage and charming boutiques. Stop in Rivercenter Mall offering over 130 stores & restaurants.

2 THE BUCKHORN SALOON & MUSEUM

The Saloon is rich in history, with many of its original furnishings. There are two museums. The Buckhorn Museum has over 520 species of wildlife from all over the world, including many record holders. The Texas Ranger



Museum houses hundreds of historical artifacts as well as Ranger Town, a recreation of San Antonio at the turn of the century.

3 AZTEC BUILDING

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1992, the famed Aztec Theatre was originally built in 1926. Meticulously restored this grand venue serves as a reminder of a time when style, artistry and craftsmanship were essential elements of building design. Epic in scale and awesome to behold, this architectural marvel is the crown jewel of the San Antonio River Walk.



4 SAN FERNANDO CATHEDRAL

The oldest cathedral sanctuary in the United States built in 1734 by settlers from the Canary Islands. General Santa Anna raised the flag of "No Quarter" from the tower of the cathedral during the Alamo in 1836. See where some of



SPANISH GOVERNOR'S PALACE

Built in 1749 as the residence and headquarters for the captain of the Spanish Presidio. The palace walls are almost three feet thick, and the rooms are furnished with original Spanish period furnishings. Called one of the most beautiful buildings in San Antonio by National Geographic, this attraction is a must see.



5 MARKET SQUARE

Tour El Mercado, filled with shops vending colorful Mexican imports. Bargain for gifts from South of the Border and enjoy the many Mexican food restaurants. Visit the bakery at Mi Tierra and indulge in tasty pan

6 KING WILLIAM HISTORIC DISTRICT

Established in the 1840's this 25 block historic district was originally settled by prominent German merchants. Stroll down King William street, named Kaiser Wilhelm I of Prussia, and marvel at the homes nestled along the banks of the San Antonio Steves Homestead and the Carl H. Guenther both museums and available for touring.

LA VILLITA

Return to Old San Antonio, site of the city's first neighborhood dating back to the 1750's. Today La Villita is home to some of the city's most talented artisans and craftsmen.

HEMISFAIR PARK

Site of the 1968 World's Fair. It was created as the Texas Pavilion for Hemisfair and is now a part of the University of Texas San Antonio. Explore over 50,000 sq. feet of exhibits representing 27 ethnic groups who settled in Texas.
